

Nadda attacks I.N.D.I.A. over DMK leader's 'Sanatan Dharma' comment

 BJP president J P Nadda on September 3 appealed to people to reject the opposition bloc INDIA, which he alleged was spreading "hatred" and "poison" and attacking the country's culture and tradition. Speaking at a function in Chitrakoot city of Madhya Pradesh ahead of the Assembly polls due this year-end, Nadda also urged people to make the BJP victorious in the State and also at the Centre in the next Lok Sabha elections to help the country become the third largest economy in the world. Later, amid slogans of "Bharat Mata ki Jai", Nadda flagged off the BJP's 'Jan Ashirwad Yatra' from Chitrakoot. BJP's national general secretary Kailash Vijayvargiya and Madhya Pradesh Home Minister

Narottam Mishra, standing on a vehicle of the yatra, waved party flags as the crowd chanted "Vande Matram" and "Bharat Mata ki Jai". "Rahul Gandhi's 'Mohabbat ki Dukaan' (shop of love) has turned out to be 'nafrat failane wali dukaan' (shop spreading hatred). Why is hatred being sold in Rahul Gandhi's Mohabbat ki dukaan?" he asked. "The Opposition (INDIA alliance) that met in Mumbai a couple of days ago is attacking India's culture, tradition and religion. Has this political game plan been hatched in Mumbai? Is their politics revolving around finishing Sanatan Dharma?" Nadda asked before flagging off his party's mass outreach programme. He said a major constituent of the opposition alliance — (Tamil Nadu's ruling) DMK — has

attacked Sanatan Dharma. Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M K Stalin's son Udhayanidhi Stalin has remarked that Sanatan Dharma should be abolished and had likened it to the coronavirus, malaria, the BJP chief said. "Throw away such an alliance which is against our Sanatan Dharma and is spreading poison. They want to abolish it (Sanatan Dharma). Eradicate them. Will the opposition alliance go to the people with the issue of finishing off Sanatan Dharma for the polls," he asked. The National Democratic Alliance under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi is working with all its might to make India a developed state while the opposition's arrogant (opposition) INDI alliance gathered in Mumbai, he said. "On one hand, India is trying to

win over the sun and the moon (apparent reference to lunar Chandrayaan-3 and solar Aditya-L1 missions), on the other hand the arrogant alliance is inflicting heavy wounds on our religion, culture and tradition," Nadda said. He said people must bless BJP with victory in the Assembly polls and in the Lok Sabha polls so that the country can emerge as the third largest economy in the world. "MP has been buzzing with development since the BJP came to power in 2003. In 2002, the MP had just 620 medical seats, while it is more than 4,000 now. Then, there were 310 educational colleges. Now the number has shot up to 536. Twenty years ago, there were 23 industrial areas in MP, which has climbed to 112 now. Industries were just 0.6 per cent in MP. Now they are 24 per

cent," he said. The former Union minister said MP was number one in the country in cleanliness, water conservation and Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana. The PM Awas Yojana was derailed during the time Kamal Nath was chief minister between December 2018 and March 2020 but the BJP managed to bring it back on track, Nadda said. "During economic slowdown in the world, there is a ray of hope that the Indian economy is the fastest growing in the world," he said. It is believed that Lord Ram spent a major part of his 14-year exile in Chitrakoot. The BJP's yatra starting from Chitrakoot will end on September 22 at the famous Ram Raja Temple in Niwari district of Bundelkhand region, a BJP leader said.

Foundation stone laid for 2 food manufacturing units

 The Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan today laid the foundation stone for two units of ITC involving an investment of Rs1500 crore in the industrial area of Badiakhedi, Sehore - Integrated Food Manufacturing and Logistics Facility and Sustainable Packaging Products Manufacturing Facility. Both units will cover 57 acres, ensuring employment to 5000 people. The ITC will produce world-class Indian brands like Ashirwad floor, Sunfeast biscuits, and Yippee noodles, while the molded fiber products plant will set new standards in sustainable packag-

ing. This will provide an alternative to plastic packaging in the electronic goods, FMCG, and food and beverage sectors. The ITC investment in the food processing sector in Sehore will add value to the state's manufacturing sector and immensely support the agriculture chain. Addressing the foundation laying ceremony, Chouhan said that Madhya Pradesh has gone far ahead of other states in respect of farm growth rate, which is 18 percent for one and a half decades. He further emphasized the need to change the pattern of crop production to save farmers from crop losses and make agriculture profitable venture. In addition to conventional crops, the pro-

duction of commercial crops like medicinal plants is the most preferable. Efforts are being made to invest in agriculture-based industries to ensure good prices for farmers and provide employment to local residents. Investment Proposal of Rs.15 lakh 42,750 crore The Chief Minister said that proposals for investments totaling Rs. 15 lakh 42 thousand 750 crore have been received at the Global Investors Summit including those of ITC involving Rs. 1500 crore in Badiakhedi. He said that ITC is working for the development of agriculture in collaboration with farmers. This initiative will provide employment to 5000 people in and around Sehore. Continuous efforts are being made to facilitate more

industries and create employment opportunities for local youth. Chouhan assured that the farmers need not worry about the situation caused by scanty rainfall. He said that the demand for electricity has increased due to low rainfall. Earlier, this happened to be around 7,000 megawatts. Today it is 15,000 megawatts. Chairman of IT Limited, Sanjeev Puri, gave details about ITC's new investment ventures. MLA Karan Singh Verma, MLA Sudesh Rai, MLA Raghunath Malviya, District Panchayat President Gopal Singh Engineer, Sehore Janpad President Smt. Nawadi Bai Barela, and Municipal Council President Prince Rathore were present.

MCD cleaned 11K garbage points

New Delhi: Delhi Mayor Shelly Oberoi said on Sunday the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) has identified and cleaned more than 11,000 garbage vulnerable points and is conducting anti-larval spraying in all wards ahead of the G20 Summit. Oberoi claimed that the AAP Government in MCD tip-topped Delhi in just two months. "We used 311 App, deployed 12,000 workers and 95 machines to make Delhi clean and green," she said. In a press conference at the AAP headquarters, she said teams have been set up to clean areas adjacent to posh hotels, tourist attractions and the city airport, adding that Delhi is ready to welcome guests for the summit. "We deployed 12,000 workers on special duty to prepare Delhi for G20 summit; this includes 1500 workers in Central Zone, 1000 workers in South Zone, 1500 workers in Najafgarh Zone, 250 workers around Pragati Maidan," said Oberoi adding over 250 employees are deployed to clean Delhi's Rajghat Marg, Jawaharlal Marg, Zoo Area and Bhairav Marg, Vikas Marg, Tilak Marg. "The MCD (Municipal Corporation of Delhi) is working continuously to ensure that the roads, parks, markets and other public places are neat and clean. It is a matter of great pride for Delhi that India is hosting the G20 Summit and we will put our best foot forward. MCD is cleaning 35 prominent roads round the clock," she said. Oberoi told reporters that 11,200-11,300 garbage vulnerable points were identified and cleaned and those spots are now being beautified. Garbage vulnerable points are open places where trash is dumped regularly. Earlier in the day, Oberoi and Durgesh Pathak -- the AAP's MCD in-charge -- visited Laxmi Nagar and Narayana Vihar to take stock of the preparations ahead of the G-20 Summit. Oberoi said the MCD and the public works department are working to clean, beautify and renovate roads in the city.

Delhi Metro to sell Tourist Smart Cards at 36 stations

 In a bid to enhance the experience of international delegates and visitors attending the G20 Summit, Delhi Metro will sell 'Tourist Smart Cards' through dedicated counters at 36 stations from September 4-13. These cards, designed to facilitate seamless travel within the city. These are available in two categories -- one-day validity and three-day validity cards -- offering "unlimited rides" in the metro network. These cards will offer unlimited rides on the extensive metro network, allowing tourists to explore Delhi's prominent tourist attractions with ease. The one-day validity Tourist Smart Card is priced at Rs 200, while the three-day validity Tourist Smart Card can be purchased for Rs 500, which includes a refundable security deposit of Rs 50. These cards will grant unrestricted access to the entire metro network and no penalties or surcharges will be imposed on "Tourist Smart Cards" for issues such as entry/exit mismatches or overstaying within the system. To assist tourists in planning their journeys, the Delhi Metro Rail offers a Delhi Metro Rail

app which provides comprehensive information on the metro network. Within the app, a dedicated "Tour Guide" section showcases a list of all metro stations and nearby tourist attractions. The 36 stations where these cards will be sold through dedicated counters include -- Kashmere Gate, Chandni Chowk, Chawri Bazar, New Delhi, Rajiv Chowk, Patel Chowk, Central Secretariat, Udyog Bhawan, Lok Kalyan Marg, Supreme Court metro stations, Indraprastha, South Extension, Sarojini Nagar, Chhatrapur, Qutub Minar, Hauz Khas, Nehru Place, Kalkaji Mandir, Akshardham, Terminal 1 IGI Airport and Karol Bagh. Besides unlimited rides, these cards are of great benefit to tourists as they can seamlessly travel in the entire network from the first train to the last service available for the day, the officials said. "There are no penalties or surcharge levied on the use of Tourist Smart Cards on account of instances like entry or exit mismatch, overstaying in system, overstepping etc," the Delhi Metro said.

Red carpet welcome awaits G20 leaders, their spouses

 A red-carpet welcome awaits G20 leaders and their spouses, who will be treated to Southeast Asian, Arab and East Asian cuisines, along with fare from various Indian states including flavourful delicacies from Chandni Chowk, and innovative millet dishes, during their stay in New Delhi for the summit on September 8-10. Spouses of heads of state of various countries coming for the G20 Summit, will be treated to a special lunch at the iconic Jaipur House, on the sidelines of the mega event. The menu will also include millet-based delicacies. An elaborate spread of millet recipes has been planned for the world leaders and delegates attending the G20 Summit on September 9-10 at the Bharat Mandapam, showcasing the climate-resistant and highly nutritious coarse grains grown across the country. The cuisine is being given special attention, with over 120 chefs working at the Taj Hotel alone. A menu of nearly 500 items is being arranged, including several fusion



cuisines. The Taj has also added millet-based meals to its menu in honour of the International Year of Millets in 2023. The Taj Hotel is in full gear with preparations. The premier hotel has created a unique cuisine that uses millet in a variety of dishes. Raw Banana Barnyard millet Tikki with puffed Amaranth, Jowar-Mushroom Khichda and the multi-course millet medley with millet Thekua and a Lemon Shrikhand mille-feuille dessert will be served to first ladies and spouses of G20 leaders. Some of the dishes to be displayed include millet Brioche

Bun with Gelato (Italy), Barnyard millet Nasi Goreng (Indonesia) and Ragi Mysore Masala Dosa (India). The spouses will also visit the field research centre in IARI campus where millet crops including jowar, ragi, bajra and fox millets are at the flowering stage. They will interact with women farmers from key millet producing states -- Rajasthan, Maharashtra, Karnataka, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Uttarakhand, Odisha, Chhattisgarh, Bihar and Assam. Spouses of heads of state of various countries coming for

the G20 Summit, will be treated to a special lunch at the iconic Jaipur House. "They (spouses of heads of states) will be treated to a special lunch at the Jaipur House, and the menu will include millet-based delicacies," sources said. Jaipur House that is home to the National Gallery of Modern Art (NGMA), an official source said. The NGMA possesses a rich collection of artworks, including paintings, sculptures, photographs and other forms of art. It comes under the Ministry of Culture. The British-era edifice, one of the several former royal houses facing the India Gate circle in the heart of Delhi, was built originally as a residence for the Maharaja of Jaipur in 1936. In an interview to a new agency, India Special Secretary Muktesh Pardeshi said, "there would be an introduction to street food, and local and regional cuisines of India. The chefs are working overtime to finalise the menu, but certainly, there will be some exposure".

"Delhi is very well known for its street food, particularly the Chandni Chowk area. So, when you visit our international media centre, I am sure you will also get a taste of the street food of India," he said. He said all hotels where world leaders and delegates will be staying are competing with each other to come up with innovative millet dishes. Pardeshi said special attention is being given to the gifts for the visiting leaders and delegates with preference given to handicrafts, textile and painting traditions of the country. During the Summit meeting, the world leaders will also plant saplings of national plants or plant species native to their respective countries as part of efforts to create a G20 Garden in the Bharat Mandapam complex. For world leaders, the prime minister is conscious of the fact that the gift should connect and convey a sense of warmth. We have submitted a list of items -- whether they are paintings or handicraft items or carpets -- they will be chosen with all care and respect to the visiting dignitary," he said.

MCD picking up street dogs, before G20 Summit

 The Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) has started picking up stray dogs, mostly sterilised in "illegal" manner and without any written orders, in the wake of the G20 Summit scheduled on September 8-10. "The People For Animals (PFA) was reached out by air travellers at Terminal 2 who spotted "screaming and yelping" dogs being "dragged by neck" using wires by "what looked like class 4 untrained workers" before being bundled into vehicles, People For Animals (PFA) claimed on Sunday. Animal rights activists are up in arms over the move by civic bodies across the nation to remove stray dogs from roads falling on the routes of G20 delegates. However, recently, visuals from the city showing dogs being picked up mercilessly and locked in subhuman enclosures have surfaced online raising concerns on animal welfare and cruelty done to the dogs in the name of 'beautification' of the prominent locations near the event venue. In a statement PFA said another stray dog feeder also approached the PFA saying that a lactating mother with tiny pups was picked up from Pragati Maidan and "no one

knows if all the pups have been taken or some carelessly left behind". The animal rights group said after the hasty withdrawal of its "ill-thought out order dated August 3" to remove stray dogs across 47 locations in the city, the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) has chosen to avoid sharing any plans or orders, and simply go ahead to pick up dogs randomly. The statement said on September 1, catching teams swooped down on two locations -- Pragati Maidan where the long suffering dogs had been picked just over a month ago, and the Airport terminal-2 area. "Having got wind of their intentions, the animal welfare community had actually offered its help towards the safe collection and keeping of dogs by involving local feeders in the exercise. Spurning the offer, MCD went ahead to blatantly and illegally pick up mostly sterilised dogs," it said. PFA said the airport area from where dogs have never been previously picked was targeted by three teams. "Some 60 harmless, sterilised and mostly very old dogs were caught and incarcerated at ill-equipped centres that have neither fans nor adequate staff nor even food. Only dry kibble was provided at one cen-

tre which street dogs do not eat," the group said. Ambika Shukla, trustee of PFA, said there is no need to remove friendly, gentle and sterilised dogs and if you are going to do it, do it properly. "The animal welfare community actually reached out to MCD to help towards collecting the dogs kindly and safely. Had local caretakers been involved in the process as we suggested, there would have been no cruelty, chasing or missing dogs," she said. Shukla said like other fields where experts are roped in, animal welfare people must be involved in issues dealing with stray animals. "Rough, untrained Class 4 staff cannot be expected to handle dogs humanely. Why not take those who can? Every holding unit needs to be open to feeders and caretakers towards the best care for the dogs during their stay," she said. Last month, the MCD released a circular addressing to sterilise and hide thousands of street dogs in an effort to clean up and beautify the premises chosen for hosting the G20 summit. It was said that the MCD took to 'sanitise' certain areas of the national capital such as Pragati Maidan and T2 Airport Terminal by picking up the stray dogs from there.
